Native American Diorama

Students are displaying the Texas Native American tribe that they are currently discussing in class. The report is on the Jumano, Karankawa, Lipan Apache or Caddo tribes. Your child's Native American tribe is stated above.

Construct a diorama using a small cardboard box or a shoe box showing the settlement of the group you chose to explore. A diorama will be fully explained in class.

You must include the following:

- Home
- A Landform found in this tribes region (natural landmarks found on Earth in your region, not man made)
- Food (show if the hunt or grow their food)
- Clothing
- A map of Texas that shows where your tribe is located

NO EXTENSIONS OR EXCEPTIONS FOR THIS ASSIGNMENT!

IF YOU HAVE AN EMAIL ADDRESS YOU MAY SEND ME YOUR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE ASSIGNMENT FOR CREDIT.

You are required to write a least a 1-2 page paper describing the Native American tribe you chose to illustrate in your diorama. Give facts and interesting details about the tribe.

You may find information on the computer by using Google, the age appropriate websites purchased by Aldine ISD or check books out from the our school library or a public library that you may use for information. Encyclopedias may also be used.

Resources that are available in the classroom or at school:

- The Texas History Textbook (can be checked out by the parent only from the front office)
- Your child's own Texas History notebook (they can't take them home but can record the information from their book before school (from 8:30-8:45 am), during specials, or after school-if they have a way home (from 3:45-4:30 pm) *If before or after school, please contact Mr. Harris to make arrangements.
- The Texas Studies Weekly newspapers. They will be provided as a resource from Mr. Harris in the classroom.

There will be a sign up sheet to work in class to research the Native American tribe during specials <u>FOR 20 MINUTES</u> for the following week of 11/26/2012, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. It will be your child's responsibility to sign up for a time during their specials if they choose to to get information that they may need. REMEMBER: If your child wants to do research before or after school your child must contact Mr. Harris to make arrangements.

List your resources in a Bibliography at the end of your paper. Your paper MUST be hand written. Bibliographies will be discussed over this next week.

Projects turned in late will result in a 10 point each day penalty subtracted from the rubric grade. NO EXCEPTIONS

A FEW IDEAS TO HELP YOU ALONG ...

- Cover the exterior of your box with construction paper.
- Decorate the interior of your box do not forget to add background details. (use any of the following options)
 - a. Cover the interior with colored paper
 - b. Paint the inside using poster or acrylic paint or,
 - c. Go online and search for an image Hopi Point
- Build the Native American homes/village.
 - http://www.susankae.com/free_resources.htm is a valuable resource I found online. You may download various paper houses to use in your diorama. The models include a tipi like the Comache's housing, and other paper houses.
- Add these finishing touches Include lifestyle details -
 - What did they eat? What did they wear?
 - What did they believe? Did they make anything?
 - Were they hunters or gathers? You can illustrate these things, create people, use resources around the house...get creative!
- Label the front of your diorama with the village name.
- Write your name on the back of the diorama.

REMEMBER: Be as creative as possible.
